

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Maya Dimitrova received her MSc in Psychology (with distinction) from St Petersburg University, Russia, in 1985, her MSc in Psychology by research (with distinction) from Warwick University, UK (1995), and her PhD in Application of Principles of Methods of Cybernetics in Different Areas of Science from ICSR-BAS (2002). Since 2007 she is associate professor, currently at the IRCS Department of Institute of Robotics at the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. She was coordinator of 2 nationally funded projects and has won twice JSPS grants for research in Japan (2006, 2015).
